SERMON FOCUS: I must put my hope in God's promise.

SERMON FUNCTION: The hearer will see reason for hope despite what is going on in the world.

BACKGROUND: Jeremiah was a prophet in Judah from 626 to 586 B. C., leading right up to the Babylonian captivity.

SCRIPTURE READING: Jeremiah 33:14-16

INTRODUCTION: Has anyone paid attention to what is going on in the world today? It looks really bad.

- The war between Russia and Ukraine has gone on for a couple of years. Russia is now threatening nuclear weapons against those who help Ukraine.
- North Korea has provided troops to help Russia in this war.
- Russia and China are increasingly conducting joint military operations.
- The war between Israel and Hamas has gone on for over a year, with both sides accusing the other of violating cease-fire agreements.
- The cost of living is extremely high, and our incoming president is poised to start a trade war.
- We are seeing an increased number of severe storms, wildfires, and other weather phenomena.
- We have a societal lack of human compassion and dignity.
- We have violence in our streets and in our schools.
- Those who proclaim the truth of God's word are increasingly ridiculed, silenced, or de-platformed. Particularly if you speak against anything in the LGBTQ agenda.
- The world has gotten to be a place of constant worry, anxiety, and stress. People really need some hope and it is hard to find.

MESSAGE:

1. THE WORLD HAS BEEN BAD BEFORE

- a. Jeremiah preached for forty years to God's chosen people and watched them continue to dive further into sin.
- b. Jeremiah was called a liar by false prophets who didn't like his message.
- c. Jeremiah was jailed for his preaching.
- d. Jeremiah had a front row seat to the destruction of Jerusalem by Babylon.
- e. Yet, despite all this, he still had reason for hope and it is the same reason for hope that we have today.

2. GOD'S PROMISES ARE STILL TRUE

- a. The days are still coming when God will fulfill His promise completely.
- b. He has already sent the Righteous Branch of David. As in the days of Jeremiah, God's people rejected Jesus during his lifetime.
- c. Christ has come, which we celebrate at Christmas. And He saved us.
- d. We have not seen a complete fulfillment of the promise however.

- i. Judas is not saved yet.
- ii. Jerusalem does not dwell securely yet.
- iii. People still live in denial of the Messiah, but He came to fulfill the promise.
- e. We can also trust the rest of God's promise because Christ is coming back.

3. CHRIST IS COMING BACK

- a. It seemed like all hope was lost when Jerusalem was destroyed. Yet, this all fit within God's plan.
- b. It may seem like all hope is lost now, but it is not.
- c. Christ's return is guaranteed, when all evil will be conquered.
- 4. THE GOSPEL IN SIMPLE FORM (adapted from Dr. James Merritt).
 - a. Bad News: We are all sinners separated from God.
 - b. Worst News: There is nothing we can do about our sin problem.
 - c. Good News: Christ did for us what we cannot do for ourselves.
 - d. Best News: Salvation and eternal life are a free gift, but you must receive it.
